我一直認爲一個人最重要 的是激情和眼光,每一個人活着 都爲自己,都想成爲更好的自 己, 如果在成爲更好自己的同 時,也能爲別人提供服務,那么 這就是生命的價值。就像 Lee 老師説的那樣:夢想是我們在任 何情形下必需要有的、不論大 小,多難多遙遠。沒有夢想就沒 有了希望,人需要寄託才有奮鬥 的勇氣。她告訴我:當年她們在 一個小辦公室中創辦一個公共 圖書館,婦女會員輪流值班.一 起夢想有一天會有一個三間房
