

640 City Jobs Available at Mayor's Youth Job Fair Over 80 additional employers will be hiring as well

Cincinnati - Mayor Mark Mallory and Council Member Laketa Cole announced today that 640 City jobs would be available at the 4th Annual Mayor's Youth Job Fair. The jobs are part of the City's Summer Youth Employment Initiative that the Mayor and City Council have included in the last three City Budgets. The initiative employs youth ages 16 to 24 in six different programs through the Cincinnati Parks Department, the Cincinnati Recreation Commission, ArtWorks, and the Cincinnati Hamilton County Community Action Agency.



The agencies will begin accepting applications for those jobs at the Mayor's Youth Job Fair on Thursday, April 23 at the Duke Energy Convention Center from 2 to 6 pm. "Young people in Cincinnati want to work. City jobs are an excellent opportunity to not only earn money, but more importantly learn valuable skills that will help them in their future careers," Mayor Mallory said.

The Cincinnati Summer Youth Employment Initiative programs:

Green Leaf Summer Jobs in the Cincinnati Parks Department that will match youth with Park employee mentors for a variety of duties in the Parks Department. (50 jobs)

Recreation Employment Corps in the Cincinnati Recreation Commission that will hire interns to help run Recreation Centers. (40 jobs)

Junior Counselor Program in the Cincinnati Recreation Commission to give employment

opportunities to 14 year old youth. (40 jobs)

Green Team in Cincinnati Recreation Commission for entry level positions in the CRC Outdoor Maintenance Division. (10 jobs)

Summer Youth Employment Program through the Community Action Agency for entry level jobs at community based organizations, government agencies, corporations, law firms, health care facilities, and small businesses. (375 jobs)

MuralWorks youth artist mural program administered by ArtWorks. More details are available at www.cincinnatiartworks.org (125 jobs)

"Today, we continue to demonstrate our commitment to our youth by not only providing them a job, but an opportunity to see the potential they have and the positive effect they can have on our community," Council Member Laketa Cole said. Gwen L. Robinson, CAA President/CEO, commented that, "CAA is honored to have been awarded stewardship of this program for the third year in a row. We applaud the city for investing in the future of our youth, especially during these challenging economic times. CAA will not take this charge lightly and will ensure that the 2009 SYEP delivers all that it promises for our youth and for the City of Cincinnati."

The Mayor was joined at the press conference by Council Member Cole, Gwen Robinson, President and CEO of the Community Action Agency, Dr. Norman Merrifield, Director of the Cincinnati Recreation Commission, and Jude Johnson, Assistant to the Director of the Cincinnati Parks Department.

Cincinnati Soap Box Derby Set for June 27 and 28 Mayor offers \$10,000 prize to winning neighborhood if 100 enter race

Cincinnati - Mayor Mark Mallory officially announced today that the 2009 Cincinnati Soap Box Derby will be June 27 and 28. The race will be on Central Avenue beginning at West 4th Street and ending near Paul Brown Stadium. As part of the derby, Mayor Mallory is sponsoring the third annual Mayor's Cup competition between Cincinnati's neighborhoods. The Mayor was joined at the press conference by Doug Newberry, the Director of the Cincinnati Soap Box Derby, and the winner of the 2008 Mayor's Cup, Tom Clifford of Pleasant Ridge. "Every year, more and more communities are competing in the Mayor's Cup. Our goal for this year is to get over 100 racers, and if we do, the winning neighborhood will receive \$10,000," Mayor Mallory said. "The derby racing brings together Cincinnati neighborhoods for a great, family friendly competition that builds neighborhood pride."

The Cincinnati Soap Box Derby has two divisions: stock division for youth ages 8 to 13 and super-stock division for youth ages 10 to 17. The Mayor's Cincinnati Cup is a competition for children ages 8-13 from the City of Cincinnati. Mayor Mallory is encouraging Cincinnati's Community Councils to sponsor entries or to recruit local businesses, organizations, or individuals to sponsor neighborhood youth. Communities can have more than one entry. Competitors interested in representing their neighborhood should contact the Mayor's office to be put in contact with their Community Council.

Soap box kits cost \$675, which includes registration, entry fee, stock car kit, racing wheels, and shipping. This year in order to help neighborhoods enter the Mayor's Cup, the City of Cincinnati will offer a \$200 rebate to neighborhoods that purchase a car and register for the race.

There are workshops for participants on Sunday, April 19th and May 17th at the BMW Store, 6131 Stewart Road in Silverton. The registration deadline is June 13th. To be eligible for the Mayor's Cup Grand Prize, competitors must attend at least one of the pre-race workshops.

The prizes will go to the Community Councils that sponsor the winning entries. If 100 cars enter the Mayor's Cup, first place will receive \$10,000, second place \$2,500, and third place \$1,000. If fewer than 100 cars enter the race, the prizes will be cut in half. The prizes and rebates are funded by the Police Department Asset Forfeiture Fund.

Soap Box Derby racing began in Dayton, Ohio with the first "All American Race" in 1934. Cincinnati held a Soap Derby Race every year until 1978. In 2006, Doug Newberry organized the first Cincinnati Soap Box Derby Race in 28 years. The overall winner of the Cincinnati Soap Box Derby will go on the National Derby Race in Akron, Ohio.
