Mr. Stan Wang, USA Originally from Solon, Ohio, I graduated from the University of Akron, where my honors thesis at the Cleveland Clinic implemented a system to differentiate heart cells from embryonic stem cells via cell-penetrating peptides. I have served on the board of two non-profits and been recognized by the U.S. Department of State, UNESCO, and Global Health Council for a public health program I began to improve child and maternal health in rural Ghana. For my PhD, I am pioneering an affordable method of generating large quantities of patient-tailored pluripotent stem cells for study and ultimately, therapy without the destruction or even utilization of human embryos, effectively bypassing the ongoing embryonic stem cell debate. After returning to the U.S. to finish medical school, I envision serving as a surgeon-scientist at the interface of medicine, science, and entrepreneurship. Ultimately, I aim to create a multidisciplinary translational research institute capable of pioneering life-saving stem cell therapies that are accessible by even those that are indigent, underserved, and marginalized around the world. An avid traveler, I have explored more than twenty different countries across five continents. I also enjoy

playing piano and composing music, participating in triathlons, and learning new languages while trekking the globe.

Honors College alumnus
awarded elite Gates scholarship

Stan Wang, an Honors College alumnus, was selected as a recipient of the Gates Cambridge Scholarship. The Gates Cambridge Scholarship is funded by the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation for graduate study and research at Cambridge University. Scholarships are awarded to approximately XX students around the world every year, making the Gates Cambridge Scholarship one of the most competitive international scholarship programs.

Wang was a member of UA's accelerated medical school B.S./M.D. program, and is currently studying at NEOUCOM. He graduated summa cum laude from the UA in 2009 with a bachelor of science in natural sciences with minors in chemistry and Spanish. Wang was previously recognized as a recipient of the National Institute of Health Oxford Cambridge Scholarship in 2010. He was also the first student at the University of Akron to be interviewed as a Rhodes Scholarship finalist.

Wang will spend the first half of his Ph.D. work at the National Institute of Health in Bethesda, Md., and complete his residence at Cambridge with the Gates Cambridge Scholarship, studying stem cell biology. He plans to use stem cell research to improve treatments for neurodegenerative diseases and other neurological conditions.

Program Synopsis

Guanlan's Sisters: A Family Journal, is the story of an American family's efforts to help poor young girls in rural China break the cycle of poverty by getting an education. The genesis of Guanlan's Sisters: A Family Journal began in 2000. Dr. Vilma Seeberg and her family were in China for an international conference and she heard about the difficulties girls in rural villages were having in getting an education. It was a problem struck a chord with Dr. Seeberg. You see, this

isn't just any family.

Vilma, Tom and Zo? Guanlan are what you might call a "global family." Vilma Seeberg is a German immigrant, a professor of education at Kent State University, has lived and worked in China, is fluent in Chinese and has written two



groundbreaking books about literacy and education in China. Her husband, Tom Jacobs, is African-American and an Emmy award-winning, veteran television producer. They adopted their daughter, Zo? Guanlan, born in Suzhou, China, in 1998 and she has grown into a wonderful energetic, inquisitive and very independent 13 year old

Determined to help, she returned to the states and established a scholarship fund named for her daughter, The Guanlan Scholarship Foundation (<http://www.guanlanscholarshipfoundation.org/>).

Through their efforts, The Guanlan Scholarship has paid the school fees for 70 girls in the village of An Jing Gou, over the past 10 years. Now for the first time the family has made the difficult journey, high into the mountains of rural China to visit the village of An Jing Gou to see if their efforts have really made a difference. Guanlan's Sisters: A Family Journal is the video diary of their journey, but more importantly it's a chance for this family and Zoe Guanlan, to connect in a very personal way with Guanlan's Sisters.
