ASIA is Ohio's premiere Asian American and Pacific Islander focused health and social services organization, providing services to the under-served, low-income, and immigrant communities. Each gala spotlights one of ASIA's many important programs and 2019's focus is on the "Communities Thriving Through Entrepreneurship" through its Apex fund for Economic

entertainment. This included the always-fun "heads or tails" coin toss game which is entered by buying one of the sixty beautiful ornamental gold fish, handmade by participants of ASIA's Lucky Seniors program. The winner won \$600 (half the pot) and as often happens, graciously donated the winnings back to ASIA. Dozens of baskets were distributed as part of the silent auction. Stanley Eng Way Naming Ceremony

Councilman Basheer Jones is posthumously honoring Mr. Stanley Eng 伍灼培, a community leader, with the addition of this honorary street name to E. 30th Street and Payne Avenue. Please join us for this street sign unveiling!

We will meet at Asia Plaza (2999 Payne Avenue), next to Li Wah, and walk to the sign at E. 30th and Payne Avenue.

Mr. Eng (1926-2004) was selected for this honor by many leaders in the AsiaTown community. He founded and led several organizations including the Cleveland Chinese Senior Citizens Association, which still exists today, and he was best known for his work on behalf of the poor and elderly residents of Cleveland's Chinatown (now known as AsiaTown). He spearheaded efforts to

provide much-needed housing for elderly Chinese Americans that resulted in the Asian Evergreen Apartments on Payne Avenue, launched a meal program serving over 50 seniors per day at Li Wah, and led English language courses at the Cleveland Chinese Christian Church.
